

ABOUT THE COALITION

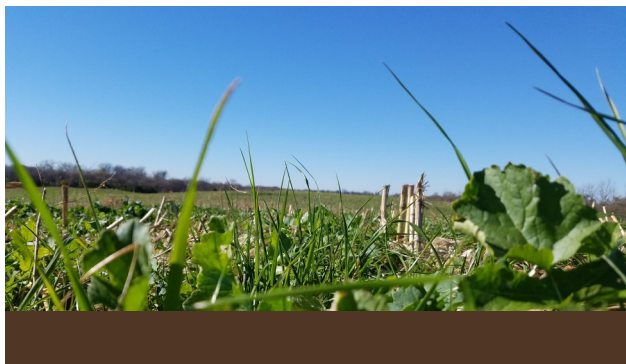
